Pace's SUPERMENtor program partners males from our local communities with each of our Head Start classrooms that provide educational services to 3-5 year old children. Each month the SUPERMENtor visits the classroom for one hour to read a book with the children and interact with them. Then the children receive a copy of the book to build home libraries. The purpose of this program is to provide positive male role models to our children, to get the community involved, and to promote reading with our students and their families.






