Thanks for all of the hard work.




Client Characteristics-7,224 families served in 2018

We hear a lot of talk about the "type" of people we serve. Here is the data so we can be sure the talk is accurate. Many people are surprised to learn that nearly half the individuals we serve are either under 18 or over 65. Only 8% have a family of 5 or more. Many are veterans or active military. Many have jobs and employment income.

Social Enterprise

11 years ago, Pace set out on a journey to generate unrestricted funds that could be used to supplement programs and services for the community. Ventures Holding LLC was created and encompasses Ventures Cleaning and WiseCAP Training & Consulting.

Over 1,500 individuals were trained

Over \$80K of unrestricted funding was generated

Ventures Cleaning Company meets the mission of our agency by teaching individuals job skills, soft skills and creating unrestricted funding for our agency.





They deemed themselves the "Successful Seven" on the first day of the JUMP! Program. This continued to be true as they completed a 7-week experiential learning curriculum that included soft skills, computer, etiquette, and other job-related trainings.





Individual Development Account (IDA)

Individuals participated in our matched savings account program. The money they saved was matched with funds from a state grant which allowed them to make an asset purchase. Individuals can purchase a car for work, a home, make home repairs, start a business or pay school costs.



Solar Energy

2018 was our first full year of having solar panels installed on our main facility thanks to a grant from Solar Uniting Neighbors. Small measures can make a big difference.





Highlights from 2018...

- ♣ Fiscal Audit NO findings
- **♣** Comprehensive Administrative Review was conducted (**no** unmet standards)
