
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
HS Transitioning Children Meeting School Readiness Goals





School Readiness

Children are assessed at least three times each school year. The results from the assessments are collected, analyzed, and aggregated. This School Readiness goal data is based on children who will be transitioning to preschool in the fall of 2024 and provides a baseline for the school year.

Pace Program Impact Data

This is a collection of data from the first quarter of the 2023-24 program year. Data is inclusive of all children and families enrolled in Head Start and Early Head Start.

Head Start provides services in education, health, parent involvement, and social services for the entire family. Head Start is an all-inclusive involvement program. Services provided include education, health, nutrition, parent involvement activities and social services for the entire family as well as, special services to children with recognized disabilities.

2 Intervention Supports

When teachers identify indicators of early developmental delays, referrals are made to the appropriate agency. Through our assessments and referrals, children may begin receiving services. An IEP (Individual Education Plan) or IFSP (Individual Family Services Plan) may be developed to support the child's development success. IEP's support children ages 3-5. IFSP's support children from birth to three. At least 10% of our enrollment, must be children with IEP or IFSP.

Parents who volunteered or worked with their child at home on activities that help the child reach their school readiness goals at least 10 hours a month were entered into a drawing for a chance to win a learning tablet. The proper technology at home to engage in virtual learning activities continues to be important in education. Teachers communicate with parents via phone, in person, text, and also communication apps that allow teachers the opportunity to share pictures, activities and classroom updates with the family. The learning tablet also helps support the communication.
